How to Design a Poster

The diagram below shows you how to draw a dunlin, a type of local shorebird. Your shorebird may have a different beak or color pattern, but the steps for drawing it will be very similar!

Remember to put your shorebird into its natural habitat, like a beach, rocky shoreline, mudflat, or saltmarsh!

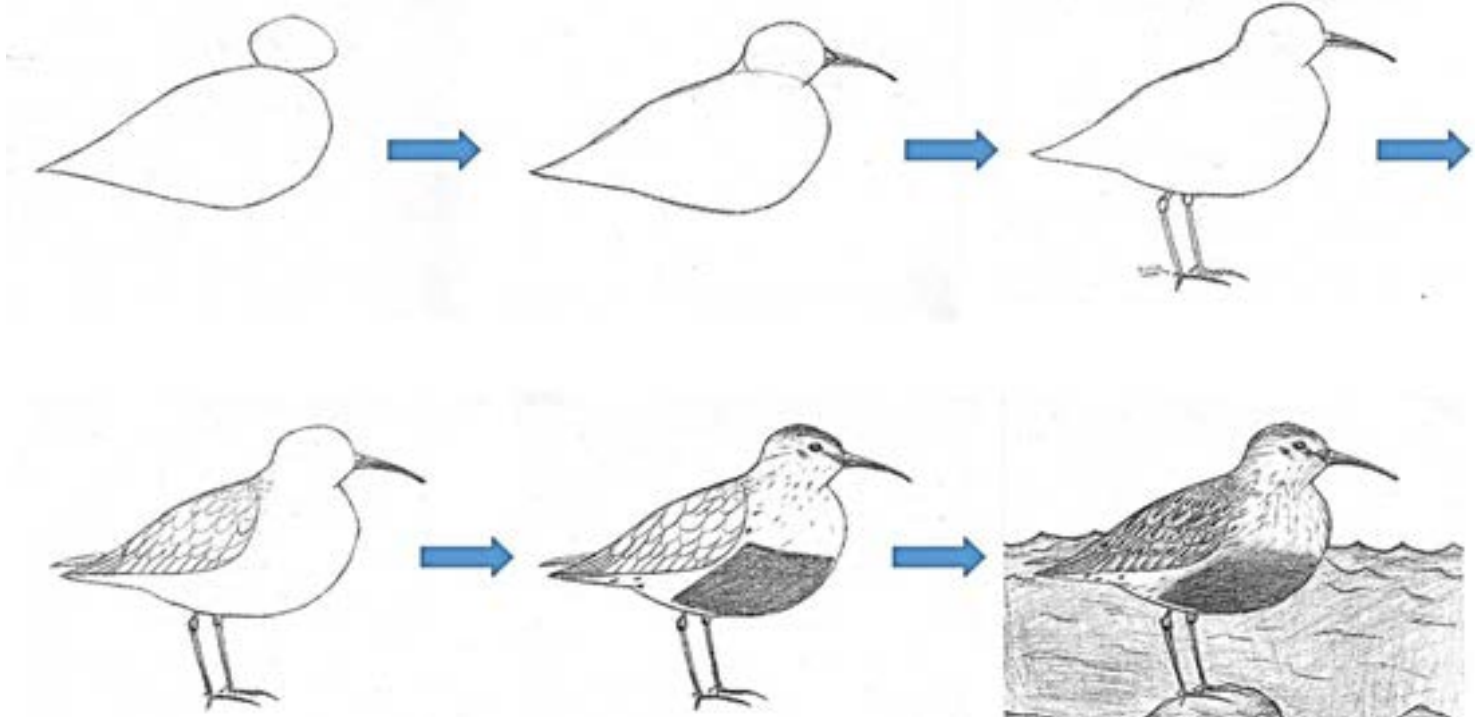
Winning posters are usually very colorful and bright. Think about how you will use color on your bird and in your background.

Who can enter: The contest is only open to students in grades 1-6 in Grays Harbor County, Washington.

Important: *Entries must be on 12 x 18 inch paper* and cannot contain any words on the front. **Glue entry form to the back of each student's poster.** Winning posters will be displayed the weekend of the Grays Harbor Shorebird and Nature Festival May 5th - 7th at Hoquiam Middle School. The Awards Ceremony will take place during the festival at Hoquiam Middle School on Sunday, May 7th. All entries will be returned to teachers following the festival.

Entry deadline: Postmarked or hand-delivered to the Port of Grays Harbor by **Tuesday, March 21st 2023**

Before submitting: Please be sure you have followed each of the following guidelines:

- The entry must be 12x18 inches.
- ***It cannot contain ANY words on the front! This includes titles, labels, names, etc.!***
- The entry must depict a LOCAL shorebird (from the above list.)
- It must be the student's original artwork.

Artwork may be disqualified by the judges if these guideline were not followed.

You can use any art medium to create your entry; crayons, markers, pencils, paints, or whatever you'd like!
